

**CITY OF OWEN SOUND  
2008 FINAL TAX BILLING INFORMATION**

Enclosed is your City Of Owen Sound Final Tax Bill for 2008.

The taxes collected are for three basic requirements: - City Of Owen Sound budgetary needs, the City's share of Grey County budgetary needs and Education Taxes requested by the Province of Ontario.

Overall, the breakdown of your tax dollar is:	City Of Owen Sound	-	55 %
	County Of Grey	-	21 %
	Education Taxes	-	24 %

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The 55 % of your realty tax dollars retained by the City has been budgeted to be spent as shown below:

Emergency Services (Police & Fire)	-	45 %
Operations (Roads, Transit, Public Works, & Airport)	-	30 %
Financial Services, I.T., & Debentures	-	12 %
Community Services (Recreation, Culture, Tourism, Planning, Art Gallery, Library, & By-law Admin.)	-	7 %
General Government, City Manager, & Corporate Services	-	6 %

Since 2008 was not a reassessment year, your 'January 1, 2005' property value is the assessed value reflected on your final tax bill.

**FINAL TAX BILL LAYOUT FOR 2008**

The Provincial Government has regulated the layout of Final Tax Bills.

If you have either Residential or Farmland assessment there will be a section on your final tax bill entitled **Schedule 2**. This section compares last year's year-end adjusted levies, local municipal and county levy changes, and education levy changes and levy changes that may be due to reassessment.

Commercial, Industrial and Multi-Residential properties have levy changes as well as 'capping' information noted on their final tax bills under a section entitled **Schedule 3**.

Various education codes may appear on your tax bill to indicate school support. These codes may be any of the following:

**EP – English Public**  
**ES – English Separate**  
**FP – French Public**  
**FS – French Separate**  
**NS – No Support**

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## TAX DUE DATES

The final tax billing will be due in two equal instalments and these are:

<b>First Instalment is due</b>	<b>July 31, 2008</b>
<b>Second Instalment is due</b>	<b>September 30, 2008</b>

Some taxpayers may have appealed their property assessment values. To ensure that penalty charges are avoided, we suggest that these taxpayers pay their instalments on the due dates.

When making payment, please detach the appropriate perforated payment stub from the bottom of your tax bill and mail it with your payment to ensure credit to your account. To reduce postage and handling costs, receipts for payment by cheque will be issued upon request only. We encourage you also to save postage by mailing to us, in one envelope, two cheques to pay your first and second instalments. Post-date your second cheque to September 30, 2008 and we will deposit it on that date.

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### **Pre-Authorized Payment Plans:**

We offer two types of Pre-Authorized Payment Plans for the convenient payment of property taxes.

When a taxpayer is enrolled in our 'Instalment Only' P.A.P. Plan each of the taxpayer's four (4) yearly instalments will automatically be deducted from his/her bank account.

Enrolling in our 'Monthly Budget' P.A.P. Plan before year-end will allow you to pay your 2009 property taxes over a ten (10) month period (ie January to October). A taxpayer participating in this payment plan will have his/her ten (10) monthly payments debited from their bank account on the last business day of each month.

Applications to enroll properties in our Pre-Authorized Payment Plans are available at our new 'Service Owen Sound' service counter located in our Financial Services Department on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of City Hall at 808 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave East. If you would prefer that we mail one of our applications to you, simply call our Financial Services Department at (519) – 376 – 4440 (Ext 239) or (Ext 249) and ask our staff to send an application to you.
