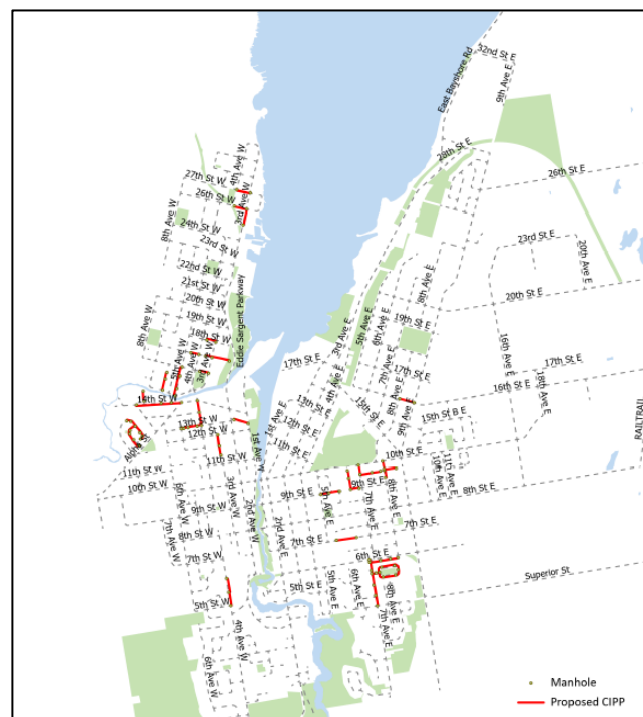
Traffic Interruptions – Wastewater Sewer Rehabilitation Work

Owen Sound, Ontario

Wednesday, May 19, 2021

Over the next four weeks, minimal traffic and parking interruptions may be experienced as the City's contractor completes sewer video inspection and prepping as part of the rehabilitation/CIPP project.

Cured-in-place (CIPP) is a no-dig method of rehabilitating and extending the life of existing sanitary sewers by lining the sewer main. This method of rehabilitating existing sanitary sewer mains eliminates the need for lengthy road closures and interruptions to road access.

Quick Facts:

- Up to 120m of sanitary sewer pipe can be re-lined in as little as four hours using the CIPP method.
- The City is planning to re-line approximately 5 km of sanitary sewer in 2021.
- Re-lining sewers prevents ground water from entering the sewer and needing to be treated at the waste water treatment plant.
- The CIPP program reduces costs up to 80% when compared to the traditional method of trenching and replacing the sanitary sewer main.

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
