IMPORTANT VOTER INFORMATION

VOTING METHODS

Internet & telephone voting is being implemented for the 2018 Municipal Election. You will be able to cast your vote from the comfort of your home – or anywhere you can access the internet or a touchtone telephone, including Help Centres throughout the City.

VOTING PERIOD

Voting is extended for this election, beginning at 10:00 A.M. on Friday, October 12th, 2018 and continuing until 8:00 P.M. on Monday, October 22nd, 2018. You can cast a vote 24 hours a day during the voting period.

VOTER LIST

Please make sure you are on the Voter List. Visit www.owensoundvotes.ca or the Clerk's Office at City Hall to confirm, register or amend your information on the list.

HELP CENTRES

Election staff will be available to assist voters at Help Centres located around the City during the voting period. See the Help Centre times and locations on the back of this information page.

WHAT DO I NEED TO VOTE?

Voters need to have a Voter Notification Letter in order to vote which will be mailed to you in October. This letter will have your instructions and your unique Personal Identification Number, required to log into the internet election site or onto the telephone election platform.

If you do not receive a Voter Notification Letter in October, please visit the Clerk's Office at City Hall with identification to confirm your registration status and receive your letter.

WHAT DEVICES CAN I USE TO VOTE?

Voters can use any device that connects to the internet including computers, tablets and smartphones. Voters can also use touch-tone telephones. Rotary phones may not be used. There will be no paper ballots for this election.

CAN I VOTE?

Any person who on Election Day (October 22, 2018) meets the following qualifications is eligible to vote:

- i. Is a Canadian citizen.
- ii. Is at least 18 years old on Election Day.
- iii. Resides in the City, or is the owner or tenant of land in the City, or the spouse of such a person.
(Non-residential commercial or industrial property electors are not entitled to vote for school board trustees but are entitled to vote for other municipal offices or questions on the ballot).
- iv. Is not prohibited by law from voting.

WILL THE CITY STILL HAVE SPECIALTY POLLS?

Specialty polls are not necessary with internet and telephone voting; however, election staff will be on-site at retirement homes and long-term care centres to answer questions or provide assistance during the extended voting period.
