Where are we now?

The initial schedule of the Greenwood Cemetery Master Plan Update has been revised due to operational needs in the Parks and Open Space Division.

Analysis

What have we learned so far?

On February 20, 2019 at the Greenwood Cemetery Master Plan Update open house, staff presented a presentation introducing the process and methodology, and attendees were divided into breakout groups to provide feedback on the reprioritization of the outstanding recommendations from the 2012 plan, and discuss what they appreciated about Greenwood Cemetery, and what could be improved.

14 members of the public attended the meeting.

2 recommendations outstanding from 2012 generated the most discussion and interest.

2012 Recommendation #16 -Develop a businesses case for the future expansion of the cemetery including consideration of natural burials and investigate the potential for purchase of adjacent lands

2012 Recommendation #17- That the development of a "Green/Natural Burial cemetery be considered at the future expansion of the Cemetery.

In addition to attendees at the open house, 15 emails and 2 phone calls were received voicing support for natural burials at Greenwood Cemetery by persons who were not able to attend the meeting in person.

Maintaining and restoring the heritage buildings, and GIS mapping of interment plots were also strongly supported by attendees at the open house.

Following the Open House on February 20, 2019, a 31 question online public engagement survey launched to gather feedback from residents and stakeholders regarding their sentiments about operations, services, foreseeable needs and future vision for Greenwood Cemetery.

Some qualifying questions led off the survey to help us understand who was responding.

52 responses were collected.

- 79% identified as City of Owen Sound residents. 78% of respondents indicated they lived in Owen Sound for more than 10 years.
- 63% of respondents identifies as female, 29% male, nearly 8% preferred not to identify their gender for the survey.
- 86% of respondents indicated they were not currently interment rights holders at Greenwood Cemetery.

What did the survey say?

The survey questions and associated responses are addressed in the presentation (attachment 2) that accompanies this report.

Some notable trends are:

- 91% of respondents indicated they felt the grounds and public spaces are well maintained, and 89% felt that customer service at Greenwood has met their expectations.
- Most respondents who were considering purchasing interment rights at Greenwood Cemetery planned to do so more than 5 years from now.
- 23 respondents (46%) indicated they were interested in "other" interment options than what they perceived to be available now. Of those 23, 17 responses (34% of responses to question 11) indicated they would like a natural burial option.
- Question 13 sought to understand why respondents visit Greenwood cemetery, with the top 3 answers indicated as:
 - Enjoying a quiet Walk (75%)
 - Walking to read stones (62%)
 - Paying respects (51%)
- Question 14 asked "is there a service or amenity that is missing from Greenwood Cemetery". 55% of responses said nothing was missing. 45% of respondents indicated they desired something that is not currently offered. 38% specified they wished to have natural burial as an option at Greenwood.
- When asked if there were any barriers to a respondent using Greenwood Cemetery, 9 respondents indicated that a lack of a natural burial option was a barrier. 15 respondents indicated there were no barriers.
- 87% indicated they support keeping the chapel, and 85% like the idea of renovating the space to create indoor columbaria.
- Respondents were given the opportunity to provide their ideas for use of the chapel if it were to be renovated. 15 answers were provided. Several further support the indoor columbarium use.

The Natural Burial Question

Throughout the first portion of the master plan process, natural burial has been a dominant theme of public input. Many aspects of what proponents of natural burials are seeking are currently permissible at Greenwood Cemetery.

What is a Natural Burial?

Generally, proponents of natural burials seek an end of life option that has minimal impact on the environment. Embalming, finely finished caskets manufactured with metal fasteners and hinges, monuments and pesticide use for grounds keeping are examples of common practices that someone seeking a natural burial may not support.

The existing Greenwood Cemetery bylaw, and the Funeral Burial and Cremation Services Act permit all of the aspects of natural burials noted above.

- Simple wood caskets with no metal fasteners are available in local funeral homes.
- In Ontario remains are not required to be embalmed, and the Greenwood Cemetery bylaw does not require embalming.
- No vault is required in certain sections at Greenwood Cemetery
- Monuments are not required at Greenwood Cemetery
- Generally it is the practice at Greenwood Cemetery not to use pesticides.

Natural Burial is a preferred option supported strongly by respondents. Generally, the conditions desired by proponents of natural burial are permissible today under the existing Greenwood Cemetery Bylaw. As a component of the Greenwood Cemetery Master Plan Update, staff will contemplate methods of communicating and promoting permissible options for Natural Burial.

What are the next steps?

- 1) Based on public feedback via the online survey and public meeting, input from stakeholders and process observations, staff will draft recommendations that will form the basis of the Master Plan Update.
- 2) At the November 20, 2019 Community Services Committee meeting, staff will present the draft master plan for comment by committee.
- 3) On January 15, 2020 before Community Services Committee staff will host a public meeting to present the draft master plan update
- 4) At the February 19, 2020 Community Services Committee staff will bring a report outlining proposed Greenwood Cemetery bylaw updates based on the recommendations of the approved Greenwood Cemetery Master Plan Update.

Financial/Budget Implications:

The Greenwood Cemetery Master Plan Review will be performed in house by City staff.






How long have you lived in Owen Sound










I like the option of having an internment service on a weekend or holiday?










