

Gichi-Name Wiikwedong Reconciliation Garden

Doors Open Owen Sound

This garden was built to recognize and celebrate Indigenous history and culture. It is a contemplative place where you can pause, reflect and remember. The location was deliberate - once-fertile hunting/fishing grounds. As part of Doors Open, on National Indigenous Peoples Day (June 21), come and celebrate the history, heritage resilience and diversity of Canada's First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples.

British Methodist Episcopal Church

Doors Open Owen Sound

This church was built in 1889 for the West Side Methodists. They soon outgrew this little chapel and, in 1911, they sold it and it became the British Methodist Episcopal Church (originally known as "the coloured people's church"). Today, this diverse congregation continues to carry on the legacy of the original Black families who settled in Grev County

Community Waterfront Heritage Centre

The Marine Rail Heritage Centre, housed inside the Community Waterfront Heritage Centre, was established in 1978 by a volunteer group of enthusiasts to showcase Owen Sound's history as a thriving port. Located inside the historical railway station, this museum preserves the area's marine, rail and industrial history with artifacts, scale models, archival photos, interactive stations and railway memorabilia.



Boyhood home of the eponymous First World War flying ace, this museum invites you to explore the Bishop family and to honour the contributions of service men and women, past and present. Owen Sound Artists' Co-op

Constructed in 1905 as a retail store, this building was purchased in 1924 by a rival retailer who operated it as a dry goods store until 1989. Designated under the Ontario Heritage Act in 1990, it is now home to the Owen Sound Artists' Co-op — a gallery/retail space for area artists to showcase and sell their work.

Owen Sound Cenotaph

Doors Open Owen Sound

Dedicated on December 1, 1920 and designed by the assistant to the man behind France's Vimy Ridge monument, the Owen Sound Cenotaph serves as a memorial to Canadian veterans from the First World War, the Second World War, the Korean War, and up to the present day. Legion Remembrance Day ceremonies and memorial services are held here to this day.

Tom Thomson Art Gallery

Established in 1967 as a memorial to iconic Canadian landscape artist Tom Thomson, this gallery houses a nationally significant collection of the artist's works and artifacts. It develops exhibitions and programs that enrich the region and contribute to a national visual arts discourse. Completely renovated in 1988, the gallery features exhibition halls, collection storage, an educational studio and atrium.

Owen Sound & North Grey Union Public Library

Doors Open Owen Sound

This library was founded in 1855 as a Mechanics' Institute. The present neoclassical structure — completed in 1914 with a Carnegie Foundation grant — features exterior monumental brick pilasters with carved limestone trim and bases, and a barrel-vaulted ceiling with decorative plasterwork. An addition dates from 1972. The building was designated in 2009. Of architectural note is this library's vaulted ceiling.

Sydenham Campus

Doors Open Owen Sound

The former Sydenham Community School, built in 1967, was an elementary school until 2017. In 2018, Grey County purchased the 4,200-square-metre (45,000-squarefoot) building and turned it into a regional hub now called Sydenham Campus. The partners and tenants form a collection of trainers and businesses that support workers, entrepreneurs and local organizations by providing access to education and training.




