



Adam Mair

Born in Hamilton, Adam Mair was a first-round pick of the Owen Sound Platers in 1995. He played four seasons with the Platers from 1995 to 1999 and suited up in 37 playoff games. His 10 goals in the 1999 playoffs helped the Platers advance to the Western Conference finals. He holds the franchise record for playoff goal scoring at 17 goals alongside Kevin Hancock and Petrus Palmu. Adam was selected to compete for Canada at the 1999 World Junior Championships where they lost in overtime to Russia giving Adam and his Teammates the Silver Medal. He made his NHL debut with the Toronto Maple Leafs in the 1999 Stanley Cup Playoffs after playing for the Platers who were eliminated in late April. Mair went on to play 13 Seasons and over 600 NHL league games with Toronto, LA Kings, Buffalo and New Jersey. In Owen Sound and in the NHL Adam was a leader - his focus and commitment to his team was never questioned.
